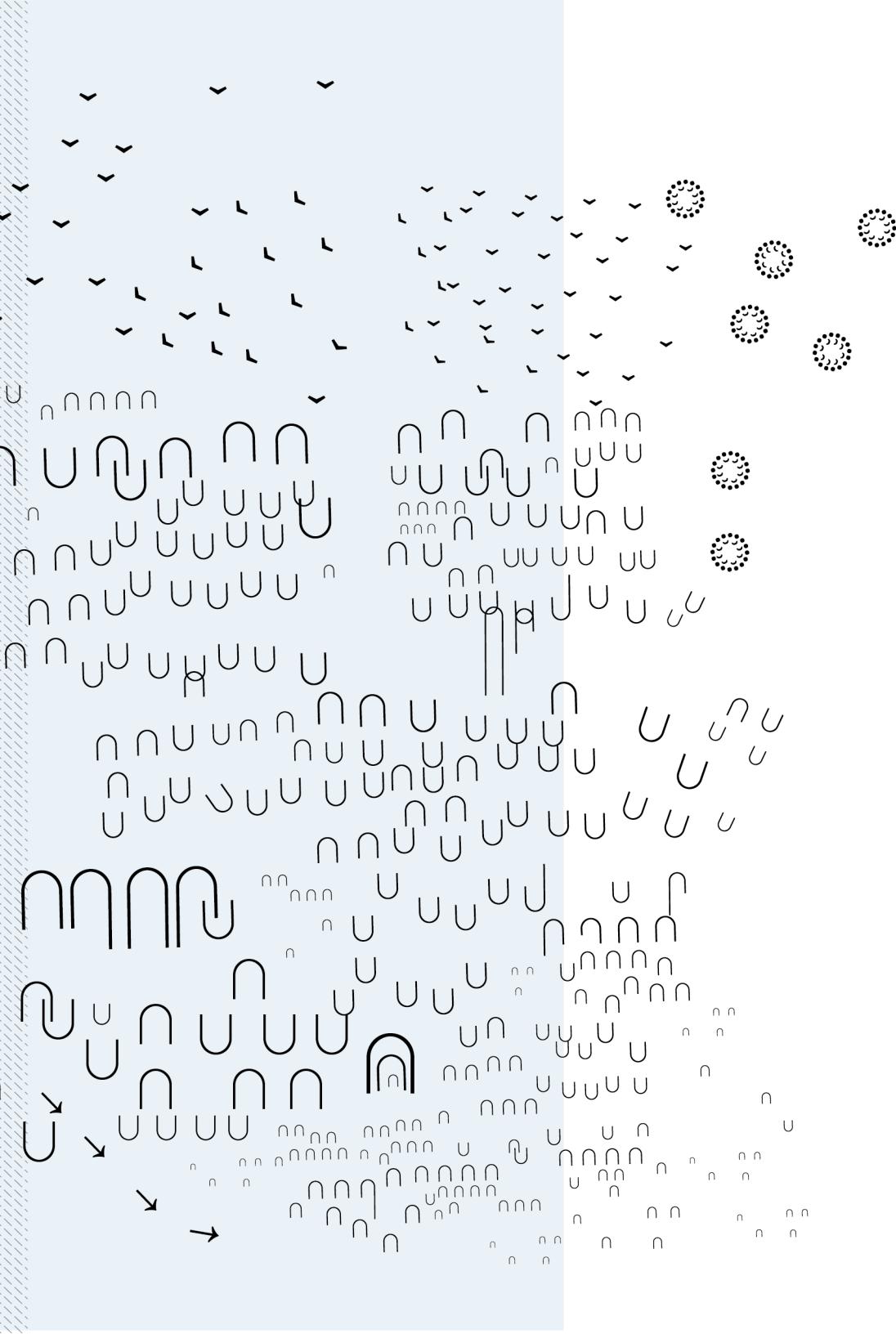

T H E U N I T Y *of* O P P O S I T E S

The unity of opposites refers to a pair of opposites that are unified in relation to their opposition.

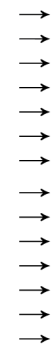
It defines a situation in which the existence or identity of a thing (or situation) depends on the co-existence of at least two conditions which are opposite to each other, yet dependent on each other and presupposing each other, within a field of tension.

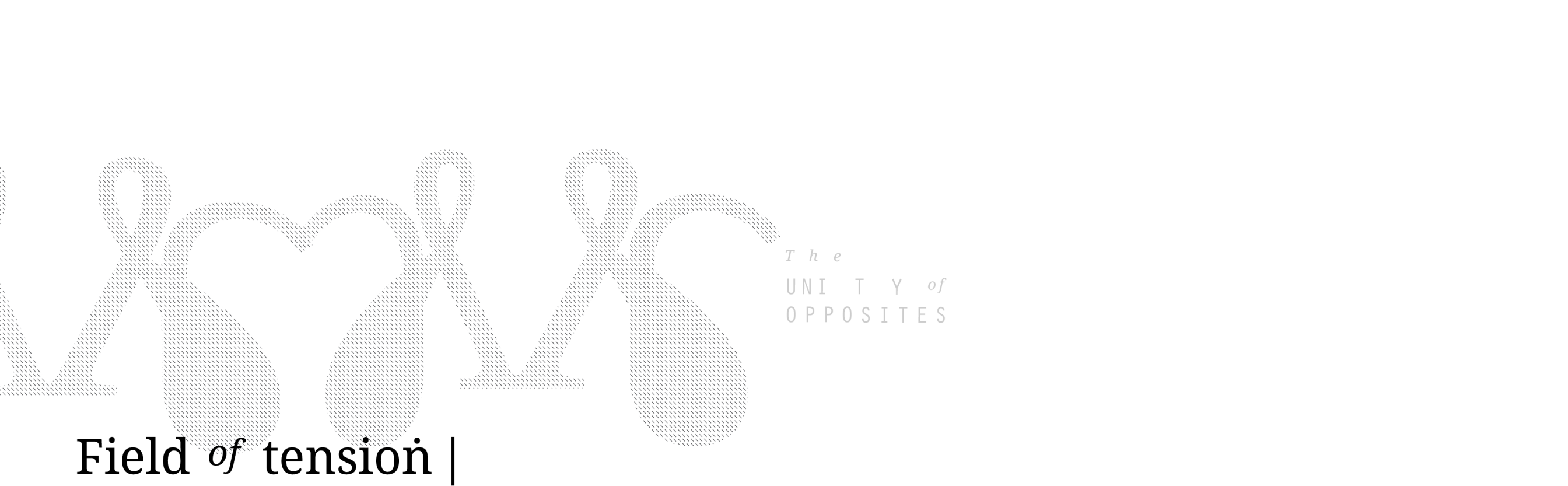
Philosophers for some

time have been contemplating the notion of opposites. The material world was composed by some indefinite, boundless cosmology from which arose the elements (earth, air, fire, water) and pairs of opposites (hot/cold, wet/dry).

As a single object persists through opposite properties, this object undergoes

change. The universe is in constant change. A war of opposites = a continuum of change. A unity of opposites will be present in the universe as difference and sameness, fluctuating with time and space, but remaining constant.

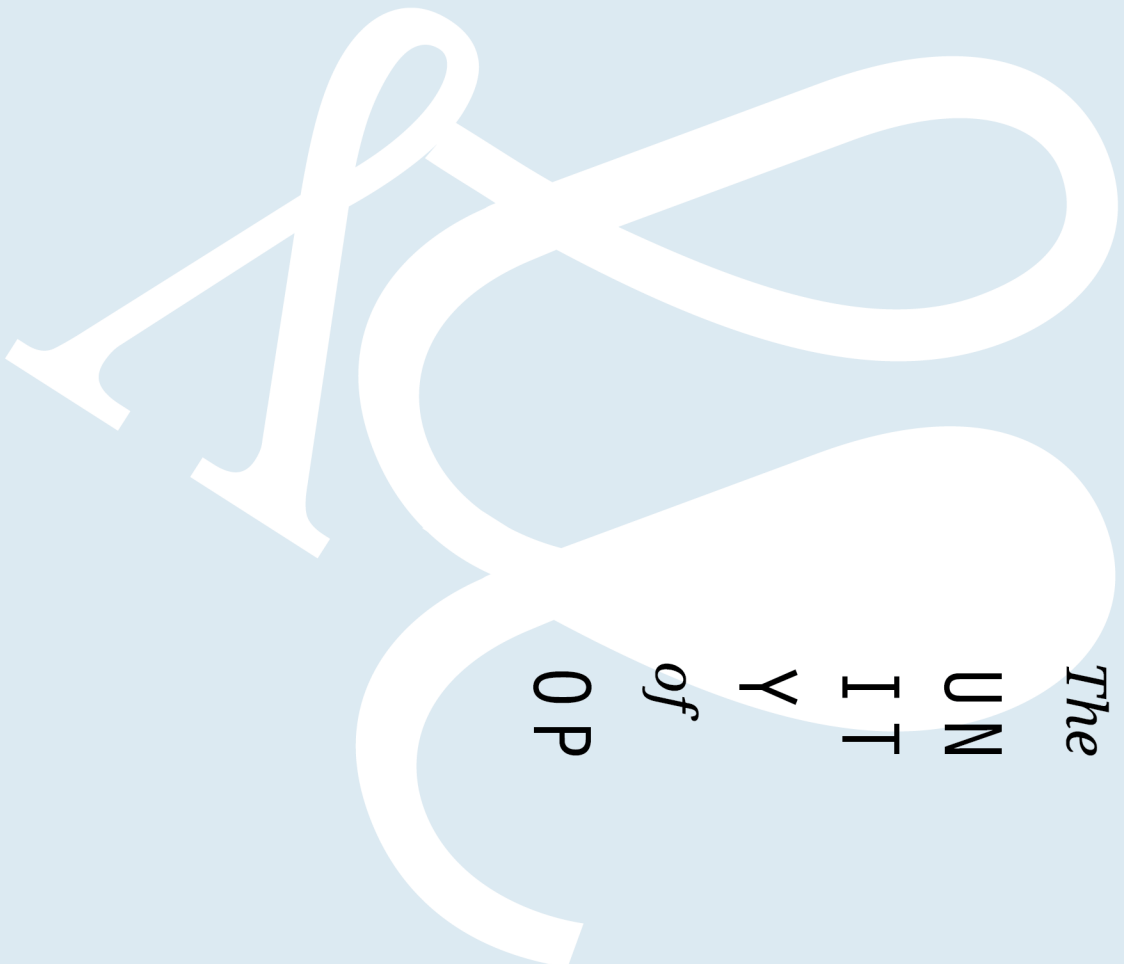

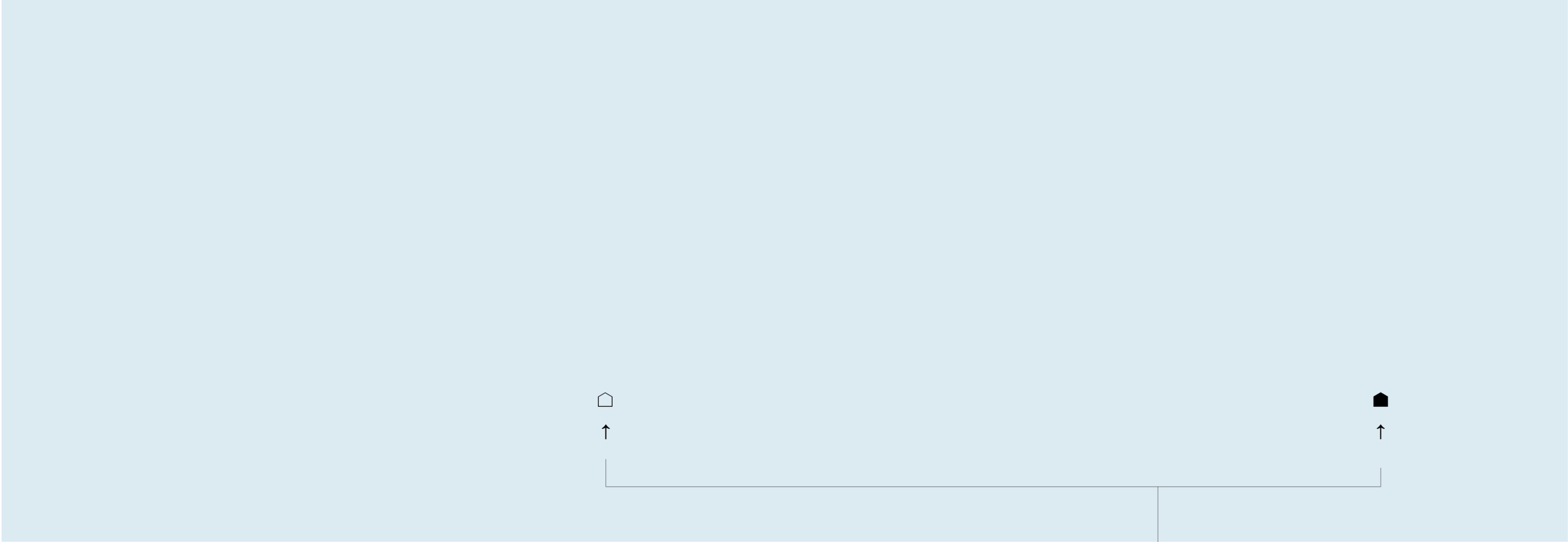
Connection:
